



Installation Instructions

Tile Panels



Before Beginning:

Tile Panels have manufactured dimensions of 22" x 122" with an intended finished dimension of 20" x 120"

Tile Panels are constructed manufactured utilizing engineered marble. Although engineered marble is very resilient, please use extra care during installation to avoid chips or cracks due to rough handling or dropped tools.

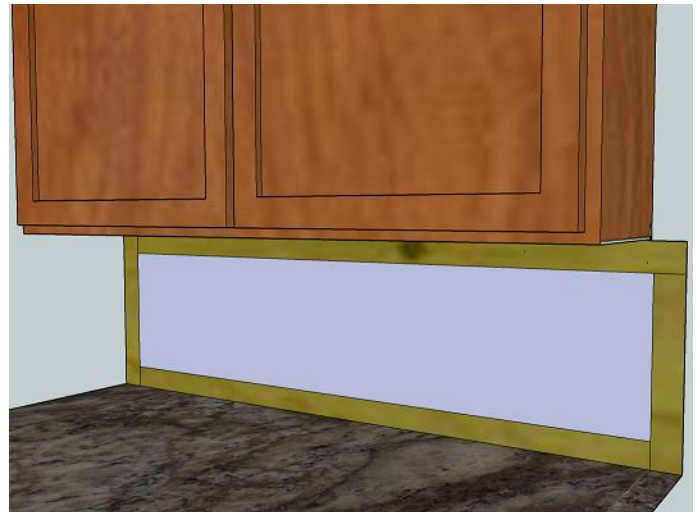
Measure the area to be covered with a measuring tape or by constructing a template of the area. For best installation results, carefully plan locations of any seams and bullnose trim locations before making any cuts.

Transfer measurements or place template on tile panel and mark cut locations. Utilizing a circular saw and masonry blade, slowly cut along marked lines to finished dimensions.

Measure and mark locations of receptacles, phone outlets, etc. and drill out using a hole saw or jig saw.



Build template utilizing cardboard or plywood and hot glue

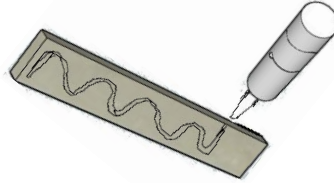

Apply clear adhesive silicone sealant generously to the unfinished side of the panel. For easier installation, use small quantities of hot glue to hold panel in place while silicone cures.

Firmly press the tile panel to the wall to install.

Cut to length and install bullnose trim to cover any exposed edges where the tile panel does not terminate into door casing, cabinets, or other trim.



Seams

In instances where seams are required, either horizontal or vertical, butt seaming is the preferred method of installation. For vertical seams, carefully determine the best location for the seam to minimize it such as behind outlet covers. Straight cuts and extra care to line up panels will ensure a great looking seam.

Horizontal seams can be addressed utilizing a butt seam or bullnose trim. When butt seaming panels horizontally, cut appropriate grout lines to match pattern to ensure a great looking seam. Bullnose can be applied between the two panels to add character and provide a great looking option.
